from CPL's Executive Director

There have been many challenges over the past 8 months, however, **we are proud to have been able to hold true to the CPL mission**, to increase the independence and quality of life of individuals with disabilities or who are in other situations of need.

In July, we held a safe and successful Team Training for teams who were delayed from participating in the spring due to the pandemic. We celebrated together at our first virtual graduation on Sunday, August 9, and for the first time, CPL supporters and graduates from across the country were able to participate and congratulate the new teams.

Communication with our graduates is always a high priority but never as important as it has been this year. The individuals we serve are some of the most vulnerable to COVID-19. Graduate support class opportunities continued with video challenges, and small, socially distanced in-person classes started in September.

We very much missed the onsite interactions with our volunteers from March through August, but on September 1, we were thrilled to welcome back a limited number of office, walking and whelping volunteers. Our plan is to continually monitor the COVID situation and work toward increasing the number of volunteers on campus.

Thank you to our donors who are continuing to give in support of the CPL mission. As you can imagine, the effects of the pandemic has impacted non-profit giving and we need your support now more than ever.

The pandemic has also created obstacles with our Puppy Raising Program. Many prison facilities have been on lockdown, not allowing outside visitors in, to protect the safety of their staff and inmates. The inmates are still working hard with the puppies, however, it has limited the amount of public socialization the puppies receive. Socialization has also been difficult for our community volunteers as many activities are limited or cancelled. We anticipate this may require additional training time for these dogs.

We are excited that another Team Training is currently underway and **I invite you to join us and celebrate the newest partnerships at the virtual graduation on Sunday, November 15.** I hope that each of you are healthy and safe. Have a wonderful fall and holiday season!

SUMMER 2020 GRADUATES

Even with the challenges presented by COVID-19, **we are extremely grateful to have the ability to move our mission forward.** Our Summer Team Training and Graduation Ceremony certainly looked different this year but we are proud to have graduated 6 service dog teams, 4 home companion teams, 1 courthouse companion and 2 breeder dogs on August 9, 2020.

Team Training is a program designed to teach the student and dog how to work together as a team. Typically, this is a 2 ½ week, group training session, however, the individuals we serve are some of the most vulnerable to COVID-19 so with a little creativity and a lot of strategic planning we were able to adjust

Team Training to keep the teams safe and adhere to social distancing guidelines. Instead of in-person lectures, information was shared via Zoom. The teams had more individualized training rather than working in a large group and, of course, masks were worn and social distancing was enforced. The teams still took a few field trips to practice navigating with their dogs in public and each team successfully completed their certification test.

Now, thanks to their new service or companion dog by their side, they have started this next phase of their life with greater independence and increased confidence to help them achieve their goals and dreams. 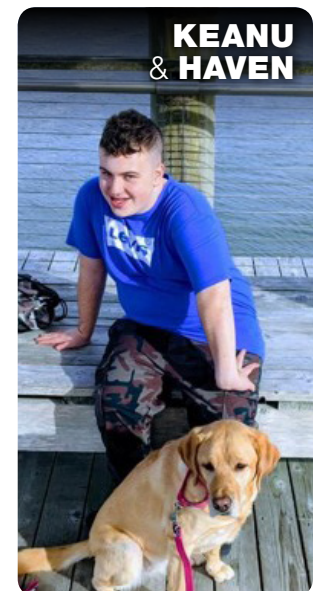

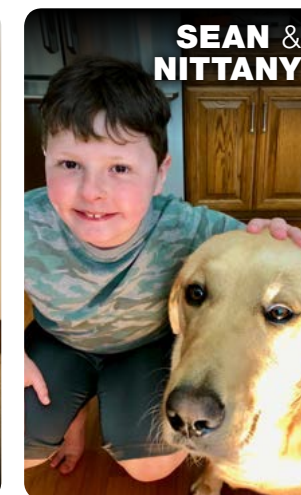

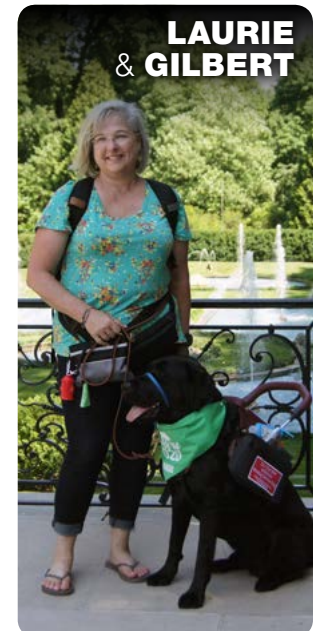

WAG WORTHY MOMENTS
DURING COVID-19

"In August 2017 we received Ramona, our wonderful courthouse companion dog that assists victims of crime. Ramona has been utilized in homicide cases, aggravated assault, arson, and sexual assault. She has been very helpful and comforting to so many people.

At the cusp of the COVID-19 pandemic, we all went from being busy every day at the courthouse to being home for a period of time. Ramona got to enjoy a little time off and give extra comfort to us while we were at home. Once we all started working a few days back in the office, I thought it would be a great opportunity for Ramona to visit with some other county offices and spread some comfort that way, since the public still wasn't allowed in the courthouse. We went from office to office to visit "socially distanced" with other county employees. People really loved the comfort she provided in an unsettling time.

As things started to get back to normal, we began using Zoom for meetings with victims. I thought it might be helpful for victims to see Ramona over Zoom. We tried it early on and it worked out great! Ramona Zoom visited with one of our victims who had already been meeting with her on a fairly regular basis. We sat Ramona in a chair in between myself and the attorney while we spoke with the girl over Zoom. Ramona sat up the whole time, looked into the screen and did a great job! The victim loved it and it really brought a smile to her face. After that, we included Ramona on a few additional Zoom sessions and even a court proceeding. As we all know, CPL dogs are very smart and well-trained to do many tasks. Ramona knows how to open office doors and apparently, she enjoyed Zoom so much that even when she wasn't being invited to be on Zoom, she would occasionally open a door on her own and burst in on Zoom session, making everyone laugh!

Now, we have started bringing people back in for in-person meetings. We are all able to socially distance in our victim witness room and Ramona is able to sit with the victim comfortably on our sofa. She always brings a smile to someone's face, whether across a computer screen or in-person. She can be a connection to the outside world—to let a victim know that she's still here, doing her job! And Ramona is always waiting until they come visit again, so she can help get them justice!"

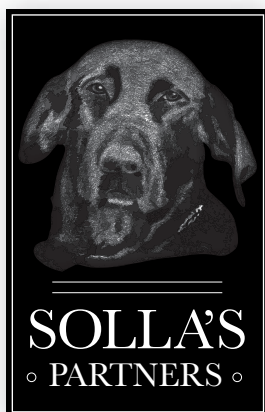
